Syllabus and Guidelines

1. There will be 80 multiple-choice questions. Each question will have four options and will carry 1 mark.
2. There is negative marking of $\frac{1}{4}$ mark for every incorrect answer.
3. For selection to BTM, BHM or B.Voc. (Food Production), the written test carries 80% weight and the Personal Interview carries 20% weight.
4. Based on performance in the written test, candidates shall be called for a Personal Interview (PI).

1. Quantitative Aptitude – 20 Questions

1. Simplification (0–5 Questions): Problems based on BODMAS Rule, fractions, percentages, approximation, decimals, surds and indices.

2. Number System (0–5 Questions): Problems based on divisibility and remainder, multiples and factors, integers, LCM and HCF.

3. Average (0–5 Questions): Questions on average weight, height, age, marks, money expenditure, temperature, etc.

4. Percentage (0–5 Questions): Calculation-oriented basic percentage problems.



- 5. Ratio and Proportion (0–5 Questions):** Problems based on simple ratios and compound ratios.
- 6. Number Series (0–5 Questions):** Completing a series, finding a missing term and finding a wrong term; patterns may involve arithmetic progression, geometric progression or more complex patterns.
- 7. Profit and Loss (0–5 Questions):** Successive selling, partnerships and discount.
- 8. Speed, Time and Distance (0–5 Questions):** Relative speed, average speed, trains, boats and streams.
- 9. Algebra (0–5 Questions):** Problems based on linear equations and quadratic equations.
- 10. Mensuration (0–5 Questions):** Areas and related problems involving square, rectangle, circle, semicircle, parallelogram, cone and cylinder.
- 11. Time and Work (0–5 Questions):** Work efficiency, pipes and cisterns, work and wages.
- 12. Interest (0–5 Questions):** Simple interest, compound interest and mixed SI–CI problems.

2. Reasoning – 20 Questions

- 1. Inequalities (0–5 Questions):** Mostly direct mathematical inequalities. Complex expressions such as $A > B \geq C = D$ and $E < B \leq F$ may be given, followed by conclusions to be deduced. Coded inequalities may also be asked.
- 2. Ordering and Ranking (0–5 Questions):** Puzzles involving age, floor, rank, boxes of different colours, order in a row, etc.
- 3. Directions and Distances (0–5 Questions):** Questions testing direction sense and distance relationships.
- 4. Coding and Decoding (0–5 Questions):** Coding-decoding in fictitious language, where statements are coded and questions are based on the given code.
- 5. Blood Relations (0–5 Questions):** Family-tree and coded blood-relation problems.
- 6. Syllogisms (0–5 Questions):** Problems with 2–3 statements and 2–3 conclusions; determine whether the conclusions follow.
- 7. Seating Arrangement (0–5 Questions):** Uni-directional and bi-directional arrangements, including facing inside, outside or both directions.
- 8. Analogy (0–5 Questions):** Analogy-based reasoning questions.
- 9. Assertion and Reason (0–5 Questions):** Questions based on evaluating an assertion and its stated reason.

3. English – 25 Questions

- 1. Fill in the Blanks (0–5 Questions):** Single- or double-blank questions based on vocabulary and/or grammar.
- 2. Reading Comprehension (0–10 Questions):** One or two passages may be given. Likely themes include economy, business, geopolitics, governance, education, technology, tourism, hospitality, transport and social issues.
- 3. Para Jumbles (0–5 Questions):** A set of sentences is rearranged to form a meaningful paragraph.
- 4. Cloze Test (0–10 Questions):** A passage with 5 or 10 blanks; topics may range from science, banking and economy to social issues. Vocabulary is generally easy to moderate.
- 5. Error Spotting (0–10 Questions):** Most likely grammar-based; identify the erroneous part of a sentence.
- 6. Word Association Pair (0–5 Questions):** Identify two words having a synonymous or antonymic relationship.



- 7. Phrase/Idiom Meaning (0–5 Questions):** Select the correct meaning of a given phrase or idiom.
- 8. Spellings (0–5 Questions):** Identify correctly or incorrectly spelt words.
- 9. Phrase Replacement / Sentence Correction (0–5 Questions):** Grammar and vocabulary, sentence construction, word order, phrasal verbs, homonyms, etc.
- 10. Synonyms, Antonyms and One-Word Substitution (0–6 Questions):** Vocabulary-based questions.
- 11. Grammar (0–5 Questions):** Active/passive voice, tenses, articles, direct/indirect speech, nouns, pronouns, adjectives, verbs, adverbs, prepositions, conjunctions and interjections.

4. General Awareness – 15 Questions

- 1. Current Awareness (5–10 Questions):** Recent events and developments.
- 2. Computer Awareness (0–5 Questions):** Basics of computer awareness, especially MS Office, operating systems, hardware, components, Internet, keyboard shortcuts, computer abbreviations and networking.
- 3. History (0–5 Questions):** General history awareness.
- 4. Geography (0–5 Questions):** General geography awareness.
- 5. Polity (0–5 Questions):** General polity awareness.
- 6. Science – Physics, Chemistry and Biology (0–5 Questions):** General science questions.
- 7. Environmental Science (0–5 Questions):** Basic environmental science awareness.
- 8. Tourism and Hospitality (0–5 Questions):** Important tourism resources of India, including fairs and festivals, cuisines, dances, music, monuments, hill stations, beaches, national parks and wildlife sanctuaries.
- 9. Economics (0–5 Questions):** General economics awareness.

Selection Process at a Glance

Stage	Weight	Details
Written Entrance Test	80%	80 MCQs; 1 mark each; ¼ mark deducted for each incorrect answer.
Personal Interview	20%	Candidates are called for PI based on performance in the written test.

Meer Sir Academy – Preparation Priority

The written paper gives the highest number of questions to English (25), followed by Quantitative Aptitude (20), Reasoning (20) and General Awareness (15). Preparation should therefore combine daily English practice with regular quantitative and reasoning problem-solving, while maintaining current-affairs, computer-awareness and tourism/hospitality revision.
